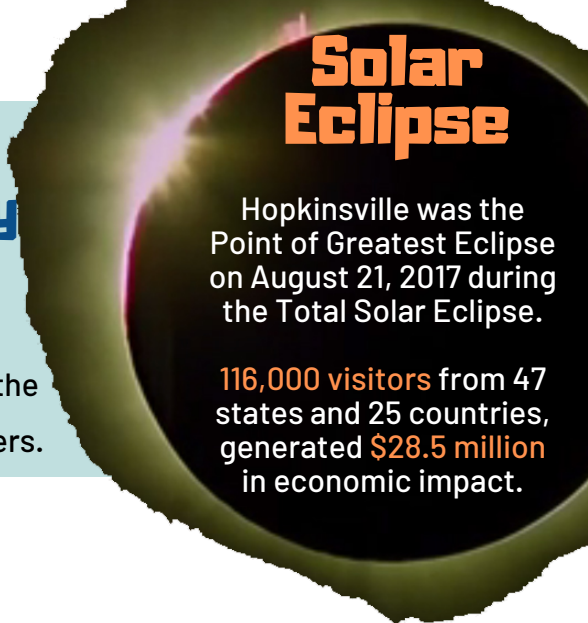




TOURISM

Hopkinsville was the Point of Greatest Eclipse on August 21, 2017 during the Total Solar Eclipse.

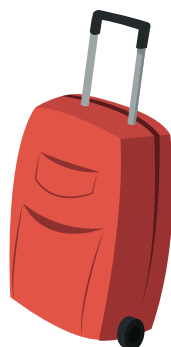
116,000 visitors from 47 states and 25 countries, generated \$28.5 million in economic impact.

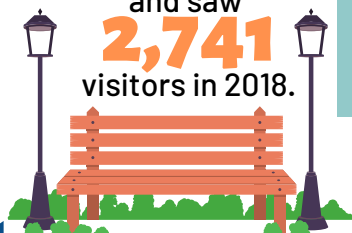

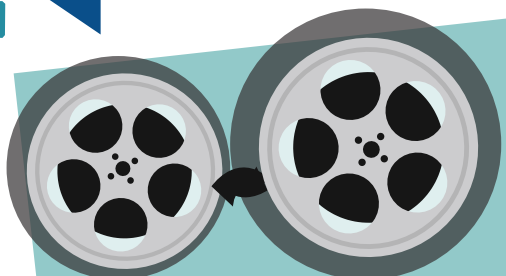
With two stops on the Craft Distillery Trail, visitors can enjoy Kentucky's signature beverage at both Casey Jones Distillery and MB Roland Distillery.
